Wed 14th	For Covid victims including those bereaved, ill, stressed, lonely, hungry, fearful or suffering domestic trauma. For tired health workers. May they find refuge in God, a very present help in trouble.
Thurs 15th	For our Government in these days of crisis and challenge. For integrity, compassionate legislation, employment and economy, and a sustainable vision for the future.
Fri 16th	For visitors to Zoom services to find faith. For the UK Church to magnify the Lord with humility, boldness and compassion, so that others see Jesus.

Sat 17th	For the devastated country of Lebanon – for hope and strength and restoration, trustworthy leadership, peace to be maintained and extremism avoided.
<b>Sun 18th</b>	For the planning and preparations for the Winter Shelter this year organised by <b>Manna House</b> . For volunteers to come forward who will be prepared to support this initiative in these difficult circumstances.
Mon 19th	For our brothers and sisters from the Salvation Army and Captain Hilary Borthwick who leads them.
Tues 20th	For our brothers and sisters at Kendal United Reformed Church and particularly as they move into the re-ordered 106 Highgate.
Wed 21st	For our brothers and sisters at Crosscrake, Natland, Old Hutton and New Hutton.
Thurs 22nd	For our working more closely together as a Mission Community even if we can't get together at the moment.
Fri 23rd	For Rev'd Craig Bentley, Assistant Curate at Natland and The Huttons, in our Mission Community, recently ordained priest.

<p>Tues 27th</p>	<p><b>Proverbs 22:6 Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old, they will not turn from it.</b> Remember our children’s Church “ketchup” and pray for the sustained faith of our children. Pray for the day that they are able to meet once again in fellowship and service of their Lord.</p>
<p>Wed 28th</p>	<p><b>Deuteronomy 10:18-19: For you have been a refuge to the poor, a refuge to the needy in their distress, a shelter from the rainstorm and a shade from the heat.</b> Pray for the families who have and are fleeing their homes into an uncertain future. Pray for the safety and security of those living in refugee camps at this time. Give thanks for the Aid agencies who work tirelessly to sustain and protect those they have been called by God to serve and protect.</p>
<p>Thurs 29th</p>	<p>We turn our thoughts to families whose lives are impacted by climate change. From droughts in Somaliland to the wildfires on the West coast of the USA, so many are suffering at this time. God of all creation, we pray for a world where inequality and environmental exploitation are no more. We pray for a world where people and our planet thrive.</p>
<p>Fri 30th</p>	<p><b>I Corinthians 13.13 : Meanwhile these three remain: faith, hope, and love; and the greatest of these is love.</b> Gracious and Almighty God, we pray that during this time of uncertainty that You will strengthen our faith in You, our hope for a future without the threat of Covid-19 and our love for one another.</p>
<p>Sat 31st</p>	<p>Pray for families distanced by the current pandemic, especially those who have been shielding since March. Thank God for His faithfulness to us and how He holds us close to Him as we cry to Him in loneliness and sorrow. Pray that we will be able to hug our families again soon.</p>
